# Listening for the Promise

Weekly Devotional



Thanksgiving Day (USA) – November 28, 2024

"Do not be anxious about anything, but in everything by prayer and supplication with thanksgiving let your requests be made known to God." -Philippians 4:6-

An English teacher once taught me that I ought to observe that in a sentence that uses the word "but," what is most important is whatever follows that conjunction. That is important for us to note when it comes to this well-known verse from Paul in Philippians. It's important for us to not ignore that conjunction because for anyone who worries or is anxious is not helped by being told, "Don't be anxious," or "Don't worry." That is bound to make someone more anxious and then become anxious about being anxious, and so on. Paul knows this problem. So, he adds the conjunction, "but" after which the most important part of the sentence follows. He knows where our anxieties can be directed and through whom we are given a peace that passes all understanding. So, he says pray to God in and about everything.

In this section of chapter four, Paul is teaching his church both the Second Commandment, how to use God's name in prayer, and also the Fourth Article of the Lord's Prayer, that not only bread on the table, but that everything we have comes from God. He wants his church to recognize that God is not stingy towards his creatures with what he has, but that he is abundant in love and with his gifts towards us. He observes how God, through their giving to him, he received "full payment, and more. I am well supplied" (4:18). He uses this example to preach to them the promise that for them, "God will supply every need of yours according to his riches in glory in Christ Jesus" (4:19). And Paul, like Luther states in the explanation of the Fourth Petition, is opening their eyes so that they will realize that God gives them everything, and more than they even think to pray for.

We will often pray for example, for good weather, good health, for work and income, a good reputation, etc. Not only does he give us every need, but (there's that word) he also gives, creates, and sustains our lives in the intricacies and minutia of everyday life, which we don't even think to pray for, like praying for every breath we take, every heartbeat, every grain in the field to sprout that eventually is baked into a warm loaf of bread for us to eat and be satisfied. Daily, God is helping us to recognize all the ways he is extravagantly bestowing his riches upon his sinners such that we are released from our anxiety and are given a peace which surpasses all understanding. In Christ and his cross you are well supplied, and more, for this life and the life to come.

Members of our group are responsible for coffee hour on Sunday, October 6<sup>th</sup>. They are Kim, Maureen, Connie, and Krisie. The November coffee hour will be November 10<sup>th</sup>. All members are asked to bring. We will be packing shoeboxes for the OCC after service and will ask people from the congregation to help pack the shoeboxes and join in on the coffee hour.

The membership committee has tabled the member project until we can find out more about 360 computer program that has been used for this in the past.

The Patriarch and shut-in list is being worked on.

The NALC Disaster Relief was discussed. So much damage has been done from the last hurricane that many people are without homes, food and personal belongings. Our group voted to donate \$1,000.00 to the NALC to help with the disaster victims and would like to continue to ask for donations from the congregation through the month of October. If you would like to donate, please make out your checks to Benevolence and mark it as disaster relief. The envelopes can be put in the offering plate.

The food pantry is still in need of items such as toilet paper, laundry detergent, soap, canned goods that contain meat such as chili, raviolis, canned tuna and chicken, soups and cereals. We will start collecting Sunday, October 6 and continue collecting through November 24, 2024. Plastic bins are in the front and back entries to put items in.

The Operation Christmas Child project will be starting soon. Items are needed to put in the shoeboxes. We are aiming to pack 200 boxes. Plastic containers have become more expensive, so we will pack in cardboard shoeboxes. If you have any at your home and would like to donate the box, we can use it. If you care to wrap the box in Christmas paper before bringing it in, that would be appreciated. Plans are being made to set up for packing on November 8<sup>th</sup> at 4:00 pm at the church, purchase any needed items on Saturday, November 9<sup>th</sup> and pack the boxes after church on Sunday, November 10<sup>th</sup>. We are asking the kids and adults from the congregation to come after the service that day to help pack some boxes. Community members are also welcome to come and help these days.

We will be taking down the Fall decorations on November 24<sup>th</sup>. Our next meeting will be Tuesday, November 5<sup>th</sup> at 6:30 pm. The meeting was adjourned with the Lord's Prayer.
